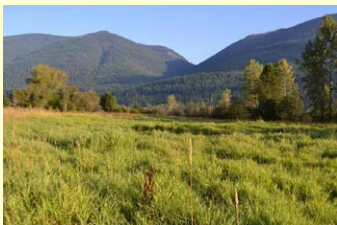

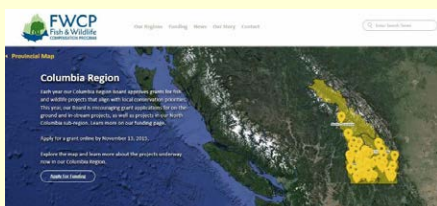


Columbia Priorities for 2016-17
