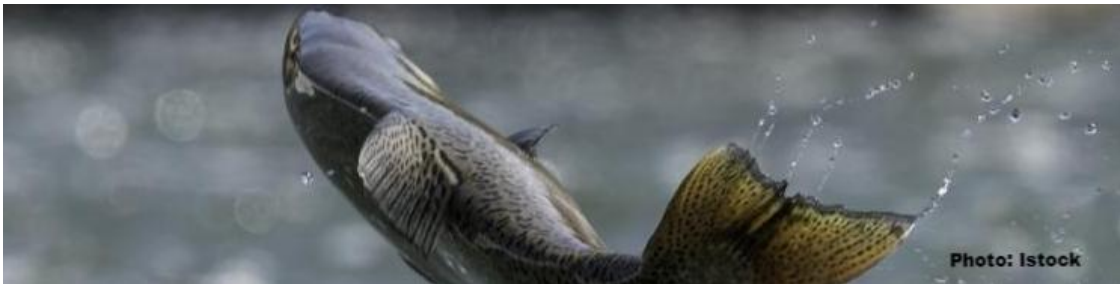




News From Our Columbia Region April 2018

118 new projects in our three regions starting now!

Our three-step review and evaluation process is complete, and our local Boards have approved 118 fish and wildlife projects valued at about \$10 million. Each of the approved projects support our mission to conserve and enhance fish and wildlife in watersheds impacted by BC Hydro dams. Many projects are hands-on, and will have an immediate benefit for species, while other projects will help improve knowledge and understanding about species, filling important information gaps leading to future conservation actions.
