\$10 million approved for 118 projects in our three regions

Our three-step review and evaluation process is complete, and our local Boards have approved 118 fish and wildlife projects valued at about \$10 million. Each of the approved projects support our mission to conserve and enhance fish and wildlife in watersheds impacted by BC Hydro dams. Many projects are hands-on, and will have an immediate benefit for species, while other projects will help improve knowledge and understanding about species, filling important information gaps leading to future conservation actions. Why we fund projects across the province

The FWCP is funded annually by BC Hydro and funds projects in our Coastal, Columbia and Peace Regions, thereby fulfilling BC Hydro's applicable water licence obligations and voluntary commitments to compensate for fish and wildlife impacts.
