Coastal Projects Announced

The FWCP-Coastal Region Board is announcing funding for 41 fish and wildlife conservation projects to be delivered across the region in 2015-16. The projects will be led and delivered by First Nations, consultants, stewardship groups and agencies. The projects represent an investment of approximately \$2 million in the FWCP's Coastal Region which includes Vancouver Island, the Lower Mainland and parts of the Southern Interior. FWCP Funds Conservation Projects Across B.C.

Across its three regions - Coastal, Columbia and Peace - the FWCP will support 124 fish and wildlife conservation projects this year for a total investment of approximately \$8.9 million in 2015-16. See map for details.

Sockeye, Chum, Pink, Chinook salmon, Kokanee, caribou, bats, owls, goshawks, herons, frogs, elk, grizzlies, snakes, bull trout, beavers and fishers are among the many species that will benefit from FWCP-supported projects across B.C. . Habitat creation, conservation and restoration will be the focus for many projects, and others on gathering information that will inform future efforts to conserve and enhance fish and wildlife impacted by BC Hydro dams.
