News From Our Peace Region September 2016

Apply for a Grant Online by October 28

We're accepting grant applications now for fish and wildlife projects starting in 2017. We offer seed grants to help get project ideas started, small grants for projects under \$20,000, and large grants for projects valued at more than \$20,000. We fund projects that align with our Action Plans and priorities. [Apply online](#). Submit your completed grant application by October, 28. And don't forget to submit your NOI by September 21, 2016 (see below).

Mandatory Notice of Intent Required by September 21

Anyone applying for a project in our Peace Region must complete and submit a Notice of Intent (NOI) by September 21, 2016. The NOI assists with engaging with First Nations and ensures your project aligns with our [Action Plans](#). New for this year is that the NOI is part of the online grant application process.
