Remember the project must align with one of our updated <u>Action</u> <u>Plans</u>, and that your online grant application must be received by 5 p.m., Friday, October 26, 2018. <u>Learn more</u>



Steps to submitting your grant application

Applying for a grant? Start here:

- 1. read our 2018 Grant Application Info Kit;
- 2. review the Priority Actions in the Watershed Action Plan of interest to you;
- 3. develop a project idea to fulfill a Priority Action in any Action Plan(s);
- 4. login to our online grant management system; and
- 5. submit your completed online grant application by 5 p.m., October 26.

Eulachon being studied in the Falls River Watershed

Eulachon is the focus of attention in a project in the Ecstalls and Lower Falls rivers near Prince Rupert. It is led by the Lax Kwa'alaams Fisheries Society and funded by the FWCP. The goal is to assess Eulachon population and habitat conditions in the rivers, and determine if the watershed could benefit from a habitat restoration plan to sustain and increase the population. <u>Read more</u>.
