Introduction to FWCP

The FWCP is a partnership between BC Hydro, the Province of B.C., Fisheries and Oceans Canada, First Nations and Public Stakeholders, to conserve and enhance fish and wildlife in watersheds impacted by BC Hydro dams.

BC Hydro fulfills water licence and voluntary commitments through the FWCP. The FWCP is funded by BC Hydro.

FWCP Mission


The Fish & Wildlife Compensation Program compensates for fish and wildlife in watersheds impacted by existing BC Hydro dams.

Columbia Region projects


40 Projects: 10 fish and 30 wildlife \$6.1 million (approx.)

Peace Region Projects


25 Projects: 9 fish and 16 wildlife \$1.4 million (approx.)

Action plans define priorities & guide our work




Strengthening First Nations engagement

Vision (where we want to get to in the long-term)

First Nations in the FWCP's Columbia Region increase their opportunities to act in their traditional role of caretakers of the land by strengthening their engagement in the FWCP's leadership, decision-making (i.e., governance), project planning, and delivery based on a three-Nation, one river, one watershed approach.

- It helps inform First Nations about your proposed project.
- It is the basis for identifying opportunities for First Nations' perspectives and engagement in your project.

Engaging First Nations: Type of relationship

Four potential types of relationships with First Nations:

Project development support. A First Nation contributes to project development (e.g., Indigenous knowledge and values incorporated into scope) and implementation (e.g., First Nations have budgeted involvement in the project).


Working relationship. Budgeted involvement in the project (e.g., First Nations technicians employed through the project).

Financial or in-kind support. A First Nation contributes funds or in-kind services that increase the total value of the project.

Support in principle. A First Nation provides a letter of support for the project but is not directly involved in the project.




NOI Process – Opt in





What will the NOI ask for?

- 1. Brief project title and summary statement
- 2. Organization/contact information
- 3. Fish or wildlife project?
- 4. Is the project led by First Nations?
- 5. Any project supporters?
- 6. Project location
- 7. Proposed single-year or multi-year project?



Submitting the notice of intent

Review the Columbia Region action plans and guidance document

Develop a project idea that aligns with a priority #1 or #2 "open" action in any action plan(s)



- 2. Other relevant guidance to support your grant application






