Have you recently seen any heron nest sites, active breeding colonies, or large groups of herons repeatedly gathering and feeding in the Columbia Basin? If so, we want to hear from you! Observations will help a breeding inventory and habitat assessment of Great Blue Herons and may alert biologists to new breeding or overwintering sites that may potentially benefit from habitat protection and/or enhancement.
