Applying for a grant? Notice of Intent opens August 3, 2017

If you are applying for an FWCP grant in our Peace Region, you must submit a mandatory online Notice of Intent by early September - date TBD. This notice helps ensure local First Nations are fully aware of your proposed project, and gives us a chance to provide guidance to you while you are developing your grant application. So start thinking about your project idea soon, and review our [Action Plans](#) now.

If you've applied for an FWCP grant before, you can start your Notice of Intent on August 3, 2017. If this is the first time you've applied online for an FWCP grant, [register online](#) August 3, and then start your Notice of Intent.

Update: mercury in fish investigation

Our comprehensive [investigation](#) to measure mercury concentrations in fish in the Williston and Dinosaur Reservoirs and tributaries started in 2016. A preliminary report (May 2017) and an overview of preliminary findings are now available. This study, together with other data, will provide updated information on mercury



levels in several fish species in the reservoirs and their tributaries.
