

## Draft Action Plans ready for final public review July 22, 2019

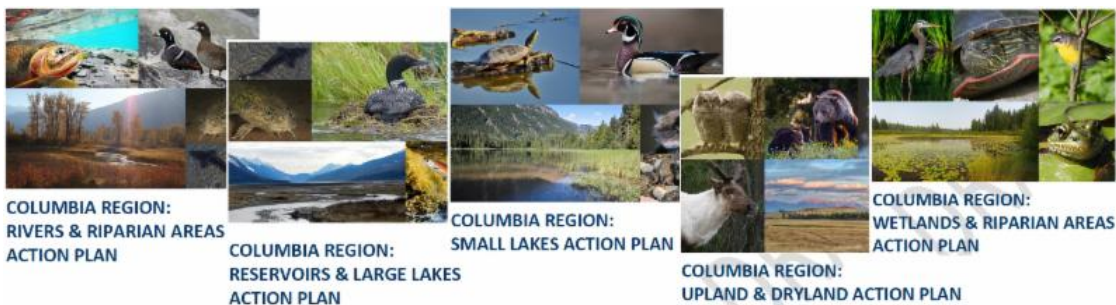
In 2018, the FWCP's Columbia Region initiated a process to update its ecosystem based Action Plans and species of interest Action Plan. The Action Plans guide decision-making and project funding decisions.

Updated draft Action Plans for our Columbia Region are available for final public review until **Tuesday, August 6, 2019 at 5 p.m. PDT.**
